

The Memorial Plaza

The 9/11 Memorial is located on the site of the former WTC complex. Its focal points twin reflecting pools that sit in the footprints of the former

North and South Towers. They feature the largest man-made waterfalls in North America and are surrounded by the names of the 2977 people on 9/11 and the 6 people killed in the 1993 WTC bombing.

Also incorporated in the Memorial Plaza:

- **The Memorial Glade:** dedicated to those who continue to battle illness and die from exposure to toxins in the aftermath of 9/11
- **Survivor Tree:** Callery Pear tree that was uncovered October 2001. A seedling from it is planted in front of the SHS 9/11 Memorial.

The Museum

The 9/11 Museum is built below-ground in the cavity of the original World Trade Center. Throughout it, you will encounter exhibits that tell the story of that day and its lasting significance.

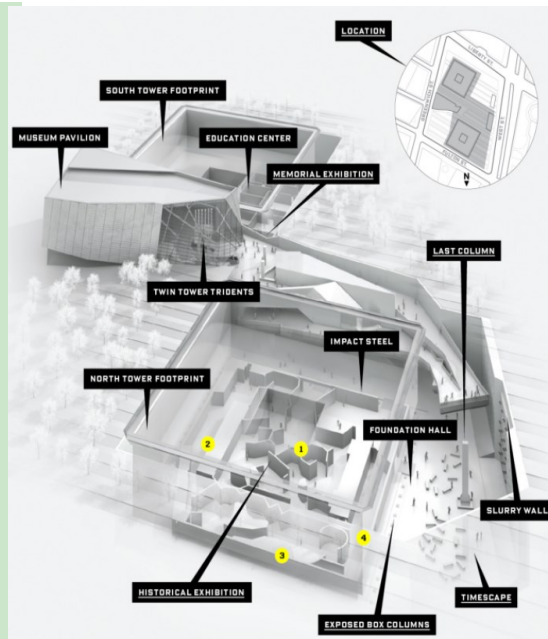


Exhibit Order:

- Ramped Descent
- Foundation Hall

The Descent:

Ramped Descent–

- listen to the personal narratives of people across the world as the events unfolded.

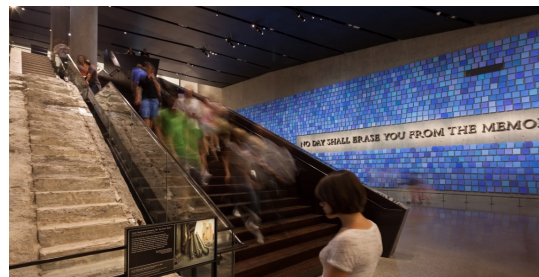
Foundation Hall–

- incorporates the original wall built to protect the WTC from the Hudson River. ** Includes **The Last Column**, removed from Ground Zero in May of 2002, when recovery efforts ended.



Survivor Stairs–

- original staircase from the World Trade Center Plaza which provided an exit for people fleeing the site.
- At the bottom is the Artwork: *Trying to Remember the Color of the Sky on That September Morning*. Composed of 2983 paper panels, it commemorates the lives lost on that sunny, clear day.



Bedrock Level:

Two main exhibits of the museum built into the footprints of the Twin Towers. (no photos)



SOUTH TOWER: MEMORIAL HALL

- Photos of the victims in alphabetical order.
- ***Includes Interactive Display– To learn more about an individual, type their name in one of the Smart-tables throughout the room. Personal photos and reflections from family members/friends will display. Information shown on the table will also be displayed on the cinema screen in the theatre in the center of room.



NORTH TOWER: HISTORICAL EXHIBIT

- Tells the story of 9/11 using artifacts, images and first person testimony with audio and video recordings. Broken into 3 parts: Events of the Day, Before 9/11 and After 9/11
- *** Alcoves– on the sides of the main room are mini-theaters that play audio transmissions from that day. Includes recordings from the 3 flights, Tower 1 and 2, FDNY, NYPD and the Pentagon.
